### First Conference:

### «The Crucial Role of Education in the Economic Development of Africa»

**Honorary Speakers: Mr. Mohamed Berrada**, Professor at Hassan II University and Mr. Ismail Douiri, General Manager in charge of the International Retail Banking and Specialized Financing Subsidiaries within the Attijariwafa bank Group.

### **Conference Summary:**

In his introductory remarks, Mr. Ismail DOUIRI began by welcoming the choice of the theme of the conference by highlighting its importance for our continent, especially in the accompaniment of African youth through innovative, viable and structured educational models.

Mr. Douiri also stressed the importance of answering a number of questions that should invite us to reflect on how our continent will be able to meet future challenges in a rapidly changing world.

Mr. Douiri structured his introduction around several questions that should give rise to deep reflection in order to take stock of actions undertaken on the scale of the continent and to think about future strategies adapted to a context in full mutation in which Africa must find its place in building its future.

Mr. Douiri said that our continent has a pool of talent that must be able to play a decisive role in the development of Africa by putting education at the heart of the skills acquisition process.

In his introductory speech, Mr. Ismail Douiri also presented the career of Mr. Mohamed BERRADA, a career of excellence, rich and inspiring with an experience that honors our country.

In his introductory speech, Mr. Mohamed Berrada praised the initiative undertaken by the Attijariwafa bank Group in organizing a symposium with a pan-African dimension, which deals with a major subject related to the development of talents and skills on a continental scale.

Mr. Mohamed Berrada stressed the importance of thinking about education in a global framework linked to a social project that will enable African economies to create positive spillover effects between several sectors. For Professor Berrada, the design of an innovative, structured and forward-looking educational offer must be done within a broader framework that takes into consideration other topics such as (the demographic challenges of Africa, health, infrastructure, transport, food, housing ...).

Mr. Mohamed Berrada stressed that African youth is the driving force of the continent which can rely on its talents to meet important challenges related to its future. Mr. Berrada highlighted the pressing need to make access to education in Africa a priority and pointed out that the continent has the highest rate of exclusion from education especially for women who have a major role in economic development. According to Mr. Berrada, more than one fifth of children aged 6 to 11 years is not attending school. This is an alarming observation that calls for a rapid, effective and sustainable response through urgent measures.

He also highlighted the importance of rapidly accelerating initiatives and structural projects to promote education in Africa, citing some countries that train 1 engineer for every 6,000 inhabitants each year, and emphasizing that China now trains 1 engineer for every 200 inhabitants every year.

Mr. Berrada insisted on the fact that education influences economic development in Africa by underlining the interdependence of the subjects and the fact that progress will be made through a roadmap that places its action in a global framework. Mr. Berrada highlighted the significant annual growth recorded each year in Africa but raised the fact that this growth must be better distributed, creating jobs and especially inclusive affecting the most disadvantaged populations.

This conference was punctuated by a series of questions/answers between the two keynote speakers, a session very rich in intellectual content and in-depth analysis. Mr. Ismail Douiri raised crucial points that he formulated in the framework of several questions to which Professor Berrada brought answers.

For his closing remarks, Mr. Berrada addressed a message to the African youth, a message of hope based on values, civism, social pact, living together, patriotism, respect for the environment, etc.

Mr. Berrada invited the youth to take their destiny into their own hands and to contribute to the development of the continent. For Professor Berrada, Africa must valorize the human, modernize its productive apparatus, locally transform its raw materials and undertake initiatives that enhance its potential and talents.

### **Second Conference:**

### «The Role of AMCI in the Development of South-South Cooperation»

Honorary Speaker: His Excellency Mr. Mohamed Methqual, Ambassador-Director General of AMCI.

### **Conference Summary:**

In his introductory speech, His Excellency Mohamed Methqual started by saluting the initiative undertaken by the Attijariwafa bank Group in organizing a symposium with a continental tone around a subject that is of particular importance for our continent.

### Third Conference:

### «South-South Cooperation, a Lever for Accelerating Economic and Social Development in Africa »

**Keynote Speakers:** Mr. **Fathallah Sijilmassi,** CEO of Positive Agenda Advisory and former ambassador, together with Mr. Youssef Rouissi, Deputy Managing Director in charge of the CIB Unit.

### **Conference Summary:**

The conference was initiated by Mr. Youssef Rouissi who started by thanking Mr. Fathallah Sijilmassi for his presence as a keynote speaker at the "African Talents" symposium organized by the Attijariwafa Bank Group. ### «Africa's Economic Attractiveness: Challenges and Prospects»

**Keynote Speakers**, His Excellency **Mr. Ibrahim Al Khalil Seck** Ambassador of Senegal in Morocco and **Mr. Jamal Ahizoune** Deputy General Manager within The Attijariwafa bank group.

### **Conference Summary:**

### **Round Table Summary:**

The round table was introduced by Mrs. Mouna Kably in charge of the Edition and Debates pole within the Attijariwafa bank Foundation. She started by thanking the honorary speakers for their interest in the Attijariwafa bank group and in the African Talents symposium.

Mrs. Kably stressed the importance of taking advantage of this new period to accelerate the development of the Group.

Mr. Coulibaly said that it is important to create mechanisms adapted to the African reality and which provide concrete responses to the continental and regional context.

Mr. Coulibaly said that the cooperation between Morocco and Côte d'Ivoire is strong and allows both countries to create constructive dynamics with interesting and sustainable economic prospects.

Asked about the dynamics carried by China in Africa, **Mr. Reda Hamedoun** stressed the fact that this crisis has allowed China to reposition itself in Africa with a dynamic of cooperation during the health crisis (donations, medical equipment, masks, signing of several partnerships). Mr. Hamedoun also pointed out the importance of the Chinese community in Africa estimated at 2 million on the continent and highlighted the economic and financial commitment of China in Africa through a few findings namely: China is the first economic partner of Africa, the first investor in Africa and the first infrastructure builder. Mr. Hamedoun also stressed that China will have more room following the slowdown of European and American initiatives on the continent.

In her speech, **Mrs. Meriem Zairi** shared her reading of the subject as an investor, highlighting the existing potential for entrepreneurship with young entrepreneurs who are innovative and create added value in Morocco and on a continental scale. Ms. Zairi stressed the importance of accompanying and supporting African talents who innovate by highlighting the need to be part of an approach to support these startups in the structuring and maturation phase of their projects.

Ms. Zairi also stressed the importance of adapting innovation to the context of emerging countries so that it is efficient and relevant by providing consistent responses to the real needs expressed in the field.

In her speech, **Mrs. Karima Mkika** evoked the crisis we are going through and the stakes linked to it at the international level. According to Ms. Mkika, whatever the country, its economy, its power, this crisis has challenged the global community on the importance of establishing new development paradigms.

Ms. Mkika highlighted the importance of putting human beings and human health at the heart of the debate and concerns of all stakeholders.

Mrs. Mkika also welcomed the momentum of solidarity launched at the level of our country under the impetus and enlightened leadership of His Majesty King Mohammed VI, may God assists Him.

Mrs. Mkika also insisted on the importance of being part of a sustainable solidarity approach based on constructive synergies between all the actors of the society. This complementarity will allow to build a solid, viable and forward-looking basis for action with large-scale and long-term actions.

**Mr. Gueye Babacar** stressed the importance of training as a fundamental lever of development within our continent.
