

Attijariwafa bank group and Finastra partner to enhance innovation in the 4th edition of the International Hackathon "Hack to the Future 2022"

Attijariwafa bank, June 3, 2022 - The Attijariwafa bank group, which places innovation at the heart of its transformation and development strategy, has partnered with Finastra, a multinational company specialized in the development of financial software, to take part in "Hack to the Future", an international Fintech movement that aims to establish sustainable and inclusive finance.

The purpose of this collaboration is to turn innovation into a real driver of value creation and inclusion for the bank as well as for its national and international ecosystem.

This partnership has resulted in the bank's employees' participation, through the WENOV entity (developers, business and technical experts), in challenges and webinars on DeFi, Cryptocurrencies, NFT...

In partnership with Wenov, the Attijariwafa Bank Foundation organized a citizen initiative to support education: 4 public high schools were mobilized with the consent of the Regional Academy of Education and Training (AREF) of Casablanca-Settat, to compete with nearly 120 students in the "Youth Hackathon" category of 10/18-year-olds. The hackathon focused on the theme of "sustainable and inclusive finance".

Furthermore, the Foundation invited volunteer employees of the Attijariwafa bank Group to coach and mentor the teams of high school students in the structuring of their projects, from ideation to the pitch, before a jury of international experts.

As such, two projects have distinguished themselves:

- "ASYLUM", a platform to connect refugees with embassies, organizations, universities and other institutions in countries around the world.
- "MERAKI", an innovative non-profit digital solution for inclusive education and sharing of knowledge and skills for the benefit of learners.

Thus, "Hack to the Future 4" has allowed young Moroccans to be involved as responsible actors in the Fintech world in order to redefine a sustainable and inclusive future for finance.
